SSSS Member “Late Breaker” and “Works in Progress” Poster Session

Sex Rising: Revolutionary and Emerging Voices in Sexual Science

November 17-20, 2016 Phoenix, Arizona (USA)

The Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality will have a Member's Poster Session that seeks to provide opportunities for our members to share late breaking work and work in progress that was not ready for submission during the regular call for abstracts. This session is designed to provide a forum to ensure that our members are able to share their important work with their colleagues.

Abstracts are due no later than September 1, 2016. Individuals with an active SSSS membership and who plan to register for, and attend the Annual Meeting can submit one abstract as presenting author. There is no limit to the number of abstracts upon which one is a co-author with another member who will be presenting. The presenting author must be an active SSSS Member at the time of the meeting.

This session is a poster only session and will be held at a special time during the meeting that is designed to facilitate networking, and the dissemination of recent work. Empirical work, lessons learned, theoretical perspectives, and other forms of sexual science are welcome and encouraged. Work in progress for which one is seeking feedback and guidance or feedback from colleagues is most welcome. Work that reflects the Annual Meeting theme is particularly encouraged.

Requirements

- ❖ The presenting author must be a member of SSSS at the time of your Call for Abstract submission.
- ❖ Members may submit one abstract for which they will be presenting author. Members may be co-authors on abstracts of other members, but may only be presenting author on one abstract.
- ❖ Presenting authors must register for the Annual Meeting.
- ❖ Posters must be formatted according to the guidelines that will be sent to all authors, and must be in the English language.
- ❖ The Preliminary Program will be posted on the SSSS website. SSSS will make all program abstracts public on its website, and authors must agree to such publication upon submission.
- ❖ Author contact information will be made available to all participants at the Annual Meeting.

REQUIRED FORMAT FOR ALL ABSTRACTS

All abstracts must be submitted to thesociety@sexscience.org by September 1, 2016. Notifications of the acceptance of the poster abstract will be sent to the SSSS Member by September 30, 2016.

Abstracts should not exceed 300 words and must conform to the structure provided below based upon the type of abstract (Empirical Reports, Lessons Learned, Theoretical Perspectives, or Continuing Education). Regardless of type, the abstract must include all required areas and sufficient detail within each area for peer review. Abstracts may be submitted in the following categories and must conform to the required format:

- a. **Empirical Reports** (for abstracts that provide details of empirical research completed or in progress). Abstracts must be formatted using the subheadings of: Background/Rationale, Methods/Planned Approach, Results/Preliminary Results, and Conclusions/Next Steps.
- b. **Lessons Learned** (for abstracts that describe the outcomes or insights gained from interventions, partnerships, or other programs). Abstracts must be formatted using the subheadings of: Background, Program Description, Lessons Learned, Recommendations.
- c. **Theoretical Perspectives** (for abstracts that provide an overview or analysis of emerging or established theoretical or conceptual perspectives on a sexuality-related issue or phenomenon). Abstracts must be formatted using the subheadings of: Background, Theoretical Perspective, and Significance to the Field.

Abstracts must be submitted using the abstract submission form included with this call for abstracts.
