Preliminary Program

Many of our cultural leaders and politicians presume that children, adolescents, and the elderly are asexual. For example, \$700 million in funding for abstinence-until-marriage “sexuality education” programs have led to these programs being taught in 58 percent of our schools nationwide. In the vast majority of social, health care, and institutional settings, sexual abstinence is also presumed and/or enforced for older citizens who are married, unmarried, widowed, straight, gay, or bisexual.

Sexologists, educators, clinicians, writers, and attorneys will join us in a presentation of papers to illuminate our understanding of child, adolescent, and elder sexualities and sexual expression, the effects of current myths and stereotypes, and the resulting social policies that affect these populations.
