Land Acknowledgement

The 2022 SSSS Annual Conference will be held in the territories of

x^wməθk^wəyəm (Musqueam),
Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), &
Selilwílth (Tsleil-Waututh) Nations.

History

The land of present-day Vancouver was inhabited by the Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh nations for thousands of years.

The Musqueam are traditional hən̓q̓əmin̓əm speaking people who have always moved throughout the territory using the resources it provides for fishing, hunting, trapping, and gathering. The name Musqueam relates back to the flowering plant, məθk^wəy, which grows in the Fraser River estuary. A sx^wəyēm that has been passed on from generation to generation explains how they became known as the x^wməθk^wəyəm – People of the məθk^wəy plant. (Source: <https://www.musqueam.bc.ca/>)

According to Squamish history, it is not known when the first humans entered Howe Sound in search of food and shelter, but it is reasonable to believe it was 5,000 years or more ago. To survive, they would have led a nomadic life, travelling wherever resources were best obtained for the time of year. As hundreds of years rolled by, they grew in number and permanent settlements began to evolve. Living in the same place for thousands of years has given aboriginal people a sense of stewardship and connection to the land which is almost extinct for Europeans. They did not feel ownership as we understand it today, they felt custodial inheritance, of a land and terrain which belonged by natural right to everyone. Oral history tells us up to 10,000 Tsleil-Waututh members lived in the traditional territory before contact with Europeans. The ancestors' survival depended on cycles of hunting, harvesting, and preserving foods, and on trade with neighbors. Originally, this great nation was about 10,000 strong, a distinct Coast Salish nation whose territory includes Burrard Inlet and the waters draining into it. (Source: <https://twnation.ca/>)

The first Europeans to explore the area were Spanish Captain José María Narváez in 1791, and British naval Captain George Vancouver in 1792. In 1827 Fort Langley trading post set up by Hudson's Bay Company and in the 1860s European settlements began. With the influx of Europeans, the Indigenous Peoples in Canada were killed in the largest numbers by European diseases such as measles, smallpox, and influenza for which they had no immunity. They also were killed by European blades and guns, and colonialism—land theft on a gigantic scale, forced removals, and exhaustion of natural resources. From the 1830s onward, the indigenous groups were encouraged—at times forced—to give up their old migratory habits, settle on reserves, learn farming and trading, and receive religious instruction. By the second half of the nineteenth century, the British Canadians were ready to do away with the political and cultural independent existence of indigenous nations. In 1867, the British North America Act united three British colonies into the first four provinces of the Dominion of Canada, establishing Canada as a federation of provinces, a dominion under the British Crown.

Two main pieces of legislation laid the foundation for what was to be the new Dominion's policy regarding relations with First Nations: the Gradual Civilization Act of 1857 and the Gradual Enfranchisement Act of 1869. This marked the beginning of the forced dependency of the First Nations on the Canadian government and the forced assimilation of the First Nations people. One could either be deemed "Status Indian" or "enfranchised" – not both. For example, if Status Indians earned a university degree or became a professional, they gained full Canadian citizenship (with or without their consent) and lost their Indian status.

Land Acknowledgement

As Prime Minister Sir John A. Macdonald said in 1887, “The great aim of our legislation has been to do away with the tribal system and assimilate the Indian people in all respects with the other inhabitants of the Dominion as speedily as they are fit to change.” Yet despite this high talk of Indian enfranchisement, the official process designed to assimilate indigenous people as soon as possible, Indigenous Peoples in Canada could not vote until the 1960s.

Today

Musqueam people continue to practice their traditions and culture daily. They do this by practicing sacred ceremonies and, more informally, through sharing meals and *sxwəyəm* amongst community and with other First Nations communities who practice the same traditions. *xwməθkwəyəm* people continue to honour their collective responsibilities to keep their culture vital and strong, share the teachings and laws, and work collaboratively to protect our environment while building a vibrant community for all. The *Skwxwú7mesh Úxumixw*, the Squamish territory is 6732 square kilometers with about 4,000 members of the Squamish Nation. They speak *Skwxwú7mesh Snichem* with the number of fluent speakers being extremely low but they are aggressive in bringing back to their youth. (Source: <https://slcc.ca/history/>) The modern era of Squamish Nation history started in 1923 when a majority of the Squamish People who were eligible voters at the time all voted to request the Federal Department of Indian Affairs amalgamate several different Indian Bands with Squamish People into a single entity called the Squamish Nation. The amalgamation request was approved and all accounts were merged, all Indian Reserve lands were to be held by the single entity, and all Squamish People were to receive equal distribution of any revenue received from any of the 26 different Indian Reserve lands that belonged to all Squamish People. Today the Tsleil-Waututh nation draws on the knowledge of their ancestors to remedy past wrongs, reclaim their territory and traditions, and advance into a bright future. They assert their Aboriginal rights and title and put the Tsleil-Waututh face back on our traditional territory in all they do. The population has increased more than 200% in the past 30 years. Today, the Nation is more than 500 people strong, including a young population and growing quickly. The stewardship ensures Tsleil-Waututh participates in all planning and development on the traditional territory, so once-abundant resources can be restored, protected, and used sustainably. They are rebuilding our culture and environment so future generations can thrive as ancestors have. (Source: <https://twnation.ca/>)

While land acknowledgment is a small part of supporting Indigenous peoples, SSSS hopes this statement will inspire others show solidarity with native communities.

SSSS Membership

The Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality (SSSS) is a non-profit international organization dedicated to the advancement of knowledge about sexuality. The Society brings together an interdisciplinary group of professionals who believe in the importance of both the production of quality research and the clinical, educational, and social applications of research related to all aspects of sexuality.

In 1957, The Society was founded to encourage rigorous systematic investigation of sexuality. The early 20th century had produced phenomenal growth in scientific understanding; however, similar gains were not being made in understanding sexuality, with knowledge often mixed with misunderstanding and confusion. Through interdisciplinary cooperation, The Society continued to support the study of sexuality as a valid area of research by the scientific community.

One of The Society's strengths is the range of disciplines represented by its members, conference participants, and journal authors. A broad interdisciplinary perspective is insured by dialogue and research contributions from biologists, physicians, nurses, therapists, psychologists, sociologists, anthropologists, historians, educators, theologians, etc.

Become a SSSS Member: Join one of the oldest global organizations of professionals interested in the study of sexuality. Keep up-to-date with the latest findings from diverse areas of research. Establish a continuing dialogue with colleagues in the sexual sciences who are working in a broad range of disciplines. Share your research, teachings, or clinical experiences with a group of professionals interested in knowing your work. The Society also has a strong commitment to "the next generation," and supports a vigorous student membership base. Become part of a close-knit community of researchers!

SSSS Member Benefits: Your membership in SSSS actively supports The Society's work in advancing knowledge about sexuality, rewarding research excellence, and promoting freedom of inquiry for researchers. Membership is on a calendar year (January to December).

Membership Eligibility: Membership in The Society is open to any person engaged directly in, or having an active interest in, the scientific pursuit of knowledge pertaining to sexuality across a wide range of academic disciplines. Individuals not meeting the criteria for membership but wishing to join can contact SSSS at TheSociety@SexScience.org.

Categories of Membership:

The Society has two dues-paying categories of membership: **Professional** and **Student**.

- **Professional Members** are persons who hold a degree from an accredited college or university (e.g., associate's, bachelor's, master's, doctoral) in a relevant academic discipline or area of expertise. All privileges and benefits of membership apply to Professional Members, including committee service, voting, and holding office.
- **Student Members** are persons currently enrolled (part- or fulltime) in an accredited college or university program and pursuing a degree (e.g., associate's, bachelor's, master's, doctoral). Student Members may be asked to validate their student status by means of submitting confirmation documents (e.g., enrollment verification) as determined by the Board of Directors. Student Members exclude any working professionals (e.g., post-docs, medical residents, medical interns, apprentices, or any other person engaged in professional activities after receiving a terminal degree) who are not also currently enrolled in an accredited college or university program. Professional Members who return to pursuing a terminal degree at an accredited college or university program may change their member type to Student Member when they renew their membership the following year. All privileges of membership apply to Student Members, including committee service, voting, and holding office (in the role of Student Representative).

The Society has two categories of distinguished membership: **Honorary** and **Fellow**:

- **Honorary Members** may be conferred on a distinguished individual to recognize outstanding achievement in the field of sexual science upon a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board of Directors. Honorary membership will extend for the lifetime of the member. Honorary members are exempt from the payment of dues; however, such members cannot serve on committees, vote, or hold office unless they also hold a Professional Membership.
- **Fellows** must hold a Professional Membership and, in addition, will have made outstanding contributions in the sphere of sexual knowledge. Fellows are nominated/self-nominated and confirmed by majority vote of the Board of Directors. Fellows who are retired or deceased, and are no longer maintaining an active membership (but were in good standing at the time of retirement or death) will become "Emeritus Fellows." Refer to the SSSS website for information on becoming a SSSS Fellow.

- Coach you to have constructive communications; and
- Give sound and practical advice to empower self-advocacy.

What about confidentiality?

The ProActive Ombuds will keep all information you provide confidential unless the Ombuds assesses and finds an imminent risk to safety.
