

VIRTUAL POSTER PRESENTATIONS

Please read the guidelines and contact the SSSS Office if you have any questions.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

All virtual presentations will be pre-recorded poster presentations. Poster presenters will be given a virtual presentation profile within the conference app. Within this, you will be able to upload your pre-recorded talk, additional information, and the poster image file.

Your presentation profile will be viewable by both virtual and in-person attendees for the entire duration of the conference, along with accessibility up to six months after the conference.

You will be given access to the Whova event application by October 22nd.

However, we encourage you to prepare the materials ahead of time.

PRESENTATION INSTRUCTIONS:

- Be concise in describing your research. Your poster should be able to be read and understood rather quickly.
- Your poster can be uploaded (as an image file) as the "Cover Photo" on your presentation profile.
 - Recommended image dimensions: 700px x 210px (Max 1000px x 1000px)
- Presenters can upload a maximum of 2 PDFs with 10 MB file size limit
 - Please consider including the following information on the PDFs: (a) title, authors' names, meeting at which the paper is being presented (i.e., "Paper presented at the Annual Conference of The Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality"), date, and the city and state of the, (b) contact information, (c) brief descriptions of the purpose of the study, the method, the results, and your interpretation of the results, (d) selected references, and (e) tables or graphs.
- Link to Pre-Recorded Video
 - o Videos should be approximately 5-10 minutes in length.
 - Preferred Video Hosting Partners: Youtube, Vimeo, DailyMotion, SlidesLive
 - Other Recommended Services: Zoom Recordings, Wistia, Sprout Video, Brightcove, iPlayerHD, VeritasTV, Crowdcast, and Wix Video
- All presentations MUST include a statement listing the Conflict(s) of Interest. If there are no Conflict(s) of Interest, please list "N/A" on the statement.

Additional Formatting Tips for Posters:

- · Use section headings to orient the viewer
- Consider using a poster template
- Make sure the font size is large enough: normal text, text in plots, and text in figures should be at least 20 points
- Length should be approximately 1,000 words.
- Use serif fonts for text (e.g., Times) and sans-serif fonts for titles (e.g., Helvetica) and headings
- Use italics instead of underlining
- · Keep graphs clean and simple
- Colors: Use a dark color for text and light color for the background. Be mindful of contrast standards.
