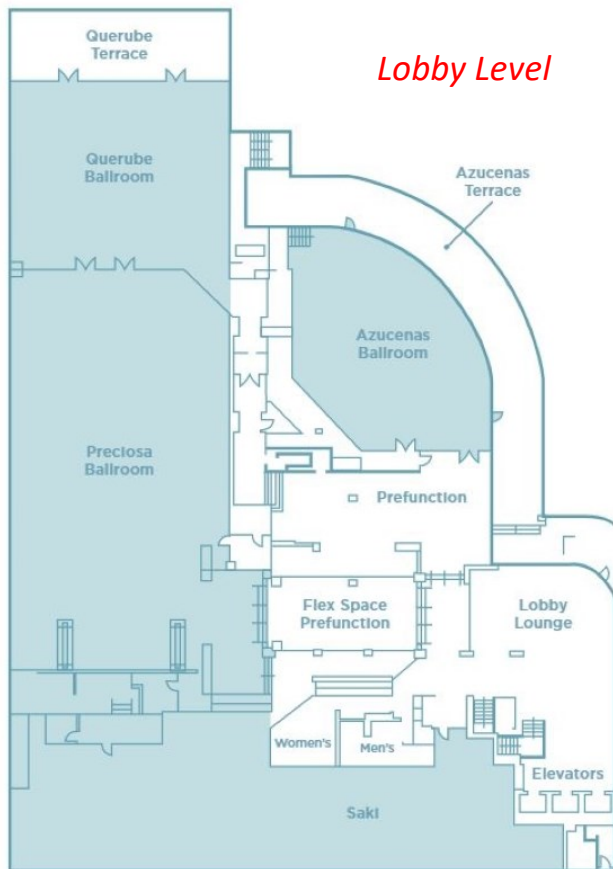

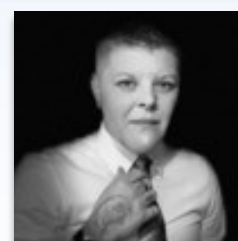

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

**The 2021 SSSS Annual Conference will be held in Borikén,
land of the Taíno people
(present-day San Juan, Puerto Rico)**

HISTORY

After laying the foundation for the trans-Atlantic slave trade, Christopher Columbus returned to the Caribbean in February 1495, taking 1,600 Taíno people by force from Borikén to be enslaved and offering “as many as they shall order” to Ferdinand and Isabella. (*Copyright: UCTP Taíno News*)

In 1508, when Juan Ponce de León heard of the gold and other resources of the island, he created the first European settlement in Puerto Rico (Caparra), not far from the modern city of San Juan. The Taíno Chief, Agüeybaná, openly greeted Ponce de León. However, conflicts soon arose as the settlers began tyrannizing the Taíno. Within a year, Ponce de León had oppressed most of the native population and gained control over most of the island. Caparra was eventually abandoned, and the settlement relocated to a coastal islet called Puerto Rico, or “Rich Port”. After a Taíno uprising in 1511, a second settlement, San Germán, was founded on the southwestern part of the island.

In the 1520s, the island took the name of Puerto Rico, and the port became San Juan. Also in 1520, a royal decree that collectively emancipated the remaining Taíno population. Ironically, by this time, the Taíno population was dwindling. Governor Manuel de Lando’s census in 1530 reports the existence of only 1,148 Taíno in Puerto Rico. However, oppressive conditions for the surviving Taíno continued, leading Carlos I (Charles V, Holy Roman Emperor and King of Spain) to decree that the natives be as free as any Spaniard. TODAY

Many histories report that the Taíno have completely vanished after the genocide. However, in 2003, Juan Martínez Cruzado, a geneticist at the University of Puerto Rico at Mayagüez, found that at least 61% of Puerto Ricans possess remnants of Taíno DNA. Despite colonization, oppression, and violence, the Taíno have not vanished and are worth celebrating. This will always be their land and we must protect and honor its history. While land acknowledgment is a small part of supporting Indigenous peoples, SSSS hopes this statement will inspire others to show solidarity with native communities.

SSSS Membership

The Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality (SSSS) is a non-profit international organization dedicated to the advancement of knowledge about sexuality. The Society brings together an interdisciplinary group of professionals who believe in the importance of both the production of quality research and the clinical, educational, and social applications of research related to all aspects of sexuality.

In 1957, The Society was founded to encourage rigorous systematic investigation of sexuality. The early 20th century had produced phenomenal growth in scientific understanding; however, similar gains were not being made in understanding sexuality, with knowledge often mixed with misunderstanding and confusion. Through interdisciplinary cooperation, The Society continued to support the study of sexuality as a valid area of research by the scientific community.

One of The Society's strengths is the range of disciplines represented by its members, conference participants, and journal authors. A broad interdisciplinary perspective is insured by dialogue and research contributions from biologists, physicians, nurses, therapists, psychologists, sociologists, anthropologists, historians, educators, theologians, etc.

Become a SSSS Member: Join one of the oldest global organizations of professionals interested in the study of sexuality. Keep up-to-date with the latest findings from diverse areas of research. Establish a continuing dialogue with colleagues in the sexual sciences who are working in a broad range of disciplines. Share your research, teachings, or clinical experiences with a group of professionals interested in knowing your work. The Society also has a strong commitment to "the next generation," and supports a vigorous student membership base, including a mentoring program of young professionals, preparing them to be leaders in their profession and SSSS. SSSS Member Benefits: Your membership in SSSS actively supports The Society's work in advancing knowledge about sexuality, rewarding research excellence, and promoting freedom of inquiry for researchers. Membership Eligibility (2022): Membership in The Society is open to any person engaged directly in, or having an active interest in, the scientific pursuit of knowledge pertaining to sexuality across a wide range of academic disciplines. Individuals not meeting the criteria for membership but wishing to join can petition the Board of Directors for an exception.

Categories of Membership (2022):

The Society has two dues-paying categories of membership: **Professional** and **Student**.

- **Professional Members** are persons who hold a degree from an accredited college or university (e.g., associate's, bachelor's, master's, doctoral) in a relevant academic discipline or area of expertise. All privileges and benefits of membership apply to Professional Members, including committee service, voting, and holding office.
- **Student Members** are persons currently enrolled (part- or fulltime) in an accredited college or university program and pursuing a degree (e.g., associate's, bachelor's, master's, doctoral). Student Members may be asked to validate their student status by means of submitting confirmation documents (e.g., enrollment verification) as determined by the Board of Directors. Student Members exclude any working professionals (e.g., post-docs, medical residents, medical interns, apprentices, or any other person engaged in professional activities after receiving a terminal degree) who are not also currently enrolled in an accredited college or university program. Professional Members who return to pursuing a terminal degree at an accredited college or university program may change their member type to Student Member when they renew their membership the following year. All privileges of membership apply to Student Members, including committee service, voting, and holding office (in the role of Student Representative).

The Society has two categories of distinguished membership: **Honorary** and **Fellow**:

- **Honorary Members** may be conferred on a distinguished individual to recognize outstanding achievement in the field of sexual science upon a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board of Directors. Honorary membership will extend for the lifetime of the member. Honorary members are exempt from the payment of dues; however, such members cannot serve on committees, vote, or hold office unless they also hold a Professional Membership.
- **Fellows** must hold a Professional Membership and, in addition, will have made outstanding contributions in the sphere of sexual knowledge. Fellows are recommended annually by the Awards Committee and confirmed by majority vote of the Board of Directors. Fellows who are retired or deceased, and are no longer maintaining an active membership (but were in good standing at the time of retirement or death) will become "Emeritus Fellows."

2022 CALL FOR PAPERS
